### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The SSSC's risk policy was last reviewed in 2017. Since then several developments in the field of risk management have taken place. Most recently the responsibility for risk for the SSSC has moved from Shared Services to the Directorate of Strategy and Performance.
- 1.2 The policy is due for review and the revised attached policy now reflects the above changes to the responsibility for risk management. This Policy was scrutinised by Audit and Assurance Committee at their meeting in December.

# 2. ONGOING DEVELOPMENTS

- 2.1 A new strategic risk register will be presented to Council in March 2020 and at this point Council will be asked to consider the risk appetite statement that will accompany the risk register.
- 2.2 Risk will now be reported as part of the Assurance Report to Audit and Assurance Committee.

## 3. RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

3.1 We do not anticipate the revised policy requiring additional resources beyond those currently deployed.
