

## PRIVACY NOTICE

### The National Fraud Initiative – privacy notice

This notice provides you with further information on the National Fraud Initiative and supplements [our Data Protection and Privacy Notice](#). The SSSC is legally obliged to provide certain personal data about staff to Audit Scotland for the purposes of carrying out a data matching exercise that helps prevent and detect fraud. The SSSC is relying on Article 6(1)(c) of the UK General Data Protection Regulation as its lawful basis for providing the data to Audit Scotland.

The data matching exercise is known as the [National Fraud Initiative](#) (NFI). This is governed by a [Code of Data Matching Practice](#) which describes the statutory basis for Audit Scotland collecting this information and sets out the principles and practices which should be adopted by those taking part. It also explains how the data used in the data matching may be further disclosed.

The categories of personal data collected under the NFI are described in the Guidance '[NFI Instructions for participants 24/25.pdf](#)'. We share the categories of personal data identified [here](#). This is personal data that the SSSC has collected for the purposes of your employment.
